On that day an innocent citizen went to a neighbour's property to help three monsters who killed him in cold blood by shooting him. All he did that day was to see if he could help his neighbours, and this was how they repaid his kindness. His name was Allan DARE. Two police officers were also murdered that day by the same criminals who shot Mr DARE. They were Constables Rachel MCCROW and Matthew ARNOLD. They were shot and executed in cold blood when they, too, were only at that property to help someone that was listed as a missing person. Two other police officers escaped from the ambush with mental scars that will haunt them the rest of their days.

In response to the tragedy the communities of Tara, Chinchilla and Miles covered their local police with love and care and well-wishes for the future. Thank you all. It was at times very difficult to keep emotions in check when members of the community approached police with condolences and shock at what had occurred. Thank you all

for the care packages, the fresh cakes and so many beautiful messages in the cards and flowers brought to the police station. There will be a time of mourning, as well as a period whereby police officers will depart from the Southwest Police District. Be assured, however, that your local police will continue to provide the service that is rightly expected from them by the communities they serve. Police look forward to working in collaboration with the community to make the community a safer place; a place where people can feel safe on the street and inside their homes.

The Murray Builders New Years Eve Races saw more than 3000 revellers and punters descend on Taroom to welcome in 2023.



The event was a sell out with people travelling from Charters Towers, Winton, Tambo and even as far away as Douglas-Daly near Darwin.

Revellers and fashionistas alike embraced the 1920s Great Gatsby theme taking part in the Senex Energy Fashions On The Field event as well as the five race programme and two fireworks displays to mark the New Year.

A special thanks does to Kelly O'Leary from Injune and the Federal Member for Flynn, Colin Boyce of Taroom for stepping in to judge when the judges were struck down by illness!

Senex Energy Community Relations Manager Trevor Robertson said Senex was proud to sponsor a great community event which boosted Taroom's economy. "This is about Senex working with the Dawson Jockey Club and our local community to host an event which provides a fun day out for locals and visitors alike," he said. "Exciting local events like this support local businesses such as retailers, accommodation providers, fuel stations, grocery shops and the pub all benefit from increased trade which in turn contributes to the sustainability and vibrancy of Taroom".

The number 7 jockey Brooke Richardson's lucky number with her riding five-year-old mare "Was Met" and threeyear-old filly "Emirate Pride" to victory in Races 1 and 2 and placing third in Race 3 on "Raspberry Bullets" (all three horses wore number 7!). But the real upset came when "Dinny's A Suspect" overcame awful form at Warwick earlier that week to beat the odds and win Race 5.

It was the first time the six year old gelding had raced at Taroom and he backed it up on January 12 when he won the \$19,000 Searle Garden Products Class 2 Plate at Kilcoy, his most significant career win.

Dawson Jockey Club President David Parry-Okeden said the great day of country racing had only cemented Taroom's reputation as a must do fixture on the country racing calendar.



"The crowd was well behaved and it's great to provide country horses, jockeys, trainers and owners a top quality meeting with many Taroom winners going on to achieve in the wider racing circuit," he said. "But

as with anything, it doesn't just happen. We couldn't do it without all the generous sponsorship from businesses such as Murray Builders and Senex Energy and our local businesses and vendors. A huge thanks has to go to all our committee members and the volunteers who spend hours and days in the lead up to host the event and then clean up afterwards," he said.

Sod-turning an exciting moment in redevelopment and expansion of the Illoura Village, Chinchilla

The first sod has been turned at Illoura Village Aged Care Home in Chinchilla, which is set to open its doors in 2024.

This is the first stage of Southern Cross Care Queensland's (SCCQ) vision and master plan which includes building a new purpose-built contemporary aged care home to accommodate up to 81 residents.



The first sod was turned by local Federal MP, Member for Maranoa, the Hon David Littleproud, SCCQ Board Chair Francis Price, SCCQ CEO Jason Eldering and SCCQ Regional Residential Manager for the Western Downs Lance Payne, along with members of the community.

They were joined by the Member for Callide, Bryson Head; Lord Mayor Western Downs Regional Council, Paul McVeigh, and representatives from Southern Queensland Rural Health, Goondir Health Services and the Toowoomba and Surat Basin Enterprise. Leader of The Nationals and Maranoa MP David Littleproud said the sod turning was a huge milestone in a new era for aged care in Chinchilla.

"I am thrilled the former grant of \$14 million I secured before the election is now locked in and the physical works are beginning," Mr Littleproud said.

"Ultimately, this project is about people and about being able to age in a place close to family, reinforcing the future of care for senior residents here and across Maranoa."

The development will also include a new Training and Education Centre to provide vital training opportunities for people in the region who are embarking on a healthcare career and responds to the need for more aged and healthcare workers in regional Australia.

SCCQ Chief Executive Officer Jason Eldering said that it was a great moment to witness the first sod being turned, after many months in the planning and consultation phase.

"Growing communities where people can live their best life and serving and supporting Queensland communities is our core mission, and this is a very exciting moment in the evolution of this project," Mr Eldering said.

"What is so exciting about this particular project in Chinchilla is that it is being purpose built to meet the clinical needs of the residents, while at the same time having that 'home-like' feeling.


"This new facility will accommodate more residents and will boost access to high quality aged care services to the local community, so residents can maintain their established connections to the area, their families and loved ones.

"The new home comprises two wings and features 81 single bedrooms each with an ensuite. Residents in each wing will have access to internal courtyards, sitting, living and dining areas and nurse stations situated in close proximity to resident common areas and rooms.

"While the new dedicated Education and Training Hub will help skill and grow a local pool of gualified allied health and nursing professionals undertaking clinical placements in aged care through a partnership SCCQ have with Southern Queensland Rural Health (SQRH).

"The challenges of providing quality aged-care in Australia's rural and remote regions continue to grow for various reasons, including the ageing population, a declining workforce, lack of housing options for new workers and uncertainty over training and immigration.

"A recent detailed economic study from Evaluate, has showcased the opportunities for better aged-care



outcomes in Australia's rural and remote towns if they are underpinned by strategic and innovative investment in healthy ageing.

"Our new Hub will also accommodate Goondir Health Services who play a critical role in providing integrated allied health, community and wellness services to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community in South East and South West Queensland.

"This sod turning is an important step for the future of Chinchilla and surrounding regions, where our deeply valued Illoura Village residents, families and the community can live their best lives," Mr Eldering said.

Tertiary Access Payment

The Tertiary Access Payment (TAP) is for students from regional or remote Australia who are going straight to tertiary study after finishing year 12.

It's a payment of up to \$5000 that you can use to help you move away from home to study.

You can claim from 1st January to 31st December in your first year of tertiary study if you're moving to study and your family home is at least 90 minutes by public transport from your place of study.

You need to be enrolled in at least 1 year of full-time tertiary study directly following year 12 or equivalent. You need to be 22 or younger on the day you start your course and your parents' or guardian's income has to

be under the threshold, parental income limit of \$250,000.

You can get the Tertiary Access Payment at the same time as other student payments like Youth Allowance, ABSTUDY, and the Relocation Scholarship.

You don't need to wait for your formal course offer to claim a student payment online.

You can claim a student payment up to 13 weeks before your course starts. That means, if your course starts in Semester 1, you can claim right now.

There's no need to wait for your formal course offer. You can list your first preference when you claim and if your plans change you can update it later.

This will put you in the best position to have your payments finalised before your course or apprenticeship starts. Claim a payment using your Centrelink online account linked to myGov.

Update from the Wind Farm

Progress to date on the farm has matched initial expectations and the project is drawing towards completion. As many of our readers may have noticed, the Dulacca Wind Farm now has 43 standing turbines in situ. The turbines are undergoing commissioning and full load testing, gradually the turbines will be switched on and come into full production over several months as they are brought on line.

Readers may be interested to know that the turbines can be turned on and off quickly so over the next few months passing motorists will start to notice individual turbines turning and not turning as the individual turbines are fully commissioned.

Recycling as the Dulacca Wind Farm Decommissions: To date the Dulacca Wind Farm has provided via direct donations well over 120,000 kgs of steel to the Miles High School, individual landowners and local organizations for reuse as building materials. Some of the local projects include steel water tank stands, steel sculptures and steel fencing posts (however, these materials are rapidly running out). In terms of timber, the volume of high quality pine timber and hardwood pieces has now exceeded 50,100 kg, which has included industrial timber pallets, domestic timber pallets, very large timber frames (suitable for immediate use as construction materials) and hundreds of large sized offcuts of builders ply (over 80 sq metres). There are no longer any large blue tarps available (over 300 were provided locally for use as heavy DUTY covers for silage and building protection etc. Over 400 strong lifting straps were also donated (but they are no longer available). Last week alone over \$15,000 (about 150 brand new light fittings were provided to the Miles High School for community projects). They are brand new 240 Volt appliances, which have just been superseded by the latest LED light fittings and are perfectly suited for multiple uses in sheds, outdoor garden tables and shelters and domestic homes. These light fittings were received as excess stock and rather than being disposed of as e-waste, were provided to the Miles High School for local projects within the community.

There are still opportunities for local individuals and organizations to collect many hundreds of other reusable sources of building materials, such as fence palings, large steel cable drums, timber cable drums (great for outdoor BBQ furniture) and other items (far too numerous to mention). If you are interested, do not procrastinate and SMS Robert Gardiner (0422 159 753) to arrange collection or to borrow the community car trailer to transport to your own location. Please SMS Robert rather than ring as mobile reception is very poor near Dulacca and he will call you back when he is in the office.



The Dulacca Wind Farm Community Car Trailer (designed and built by the Miles High School) is available for use to transport materials to local people and community organizations. The trailer (shown above) is loaded with 38 timber pallets. If you have your own transport, then large cable drums with a mass of up to 1400 kg. can be loaded onto your truck.

Santa visited QWCA Jackson


The QCWA Jackson Community Christmas Party was held on Saturday 10th of December 2022.



Cheap & Easy RECIPES



4 Ingredients Sausage Rolls



Makes 16 servings | 15min prep | 30min cook

Ingredients

- 500 grams chicken mince
- 1 carrot peeled and grated
- 1/4 cup honey
- 2 sheets puff pastry

Pineapple relish

- 1/2 small fresh pineapple, peeled, cut into 1cm pieces
- 1/2 red onion, finely chopped
- 1 long fresh red chilli, deseeded, finely chopped
- 1 lime, rind finely grated, juiced

Method

- 1. Preheat oven 200°C.
- 2. Mix together mince, carrot and honey, seasoning with sea salt and cracked pepper.
- 3. Lay a sheet of pastry on a flat surface. Cut the sheet in half.
- 4. Spoon the mince mixture down the centre of each pastry half.
- Fold the pastry over the filling, overlapping the edges, placing the join underneath to enclose.
- 6. Cut into 4 short pieces. Place on a baking paper lined baking tray.
- 7. Repeat with remaining pastry and filling.
- 8. Bake for 30 minutes or until golden.

Recipe Notes

Optional: An easy way to make the recipe go further is to grate in extra veggies; we added zucchini and onion. Or simply add 1 grated apple and ½ cup grated cheddar cheese to the above – Sensational!

Pink Lemonade Scones

Makes 12 servings | 10min prep | 15min cook

Ingredients

- Butter, to grease
- 450g (3 cups) self-raising flour
- 1 tsp rose pink liquid food colouring, to tint
- 250ml (1 cup) lemonade
- 600ml carton pouring cream
- Raspberry jam, to serve
- Pure icing sugar, to decorate
- Fresh raspberries, to serve

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 220C/200C fan forced. Grease a baking tray with butter. Sift the flour into a large bowl. Make a well in the centre. Combine the food colouring and lemonade in a jug.
- 2. Add lemonade mixture and 250ml (1 cup) cream to flour. Use a flat-bladed knife to stir until a sticky dough forms (do not overmix).
- 3. Turn dough onto a lightly floured surface. Sprinkle with flour. Use clean hands to gently press dough into a 2cm-thick disc.
- 4. Use a 7cm-diameter (at the widest point) heartshaped pastry cutter dipped in flour to cut 12 scones from the dough. Press the scraps together to form the last scones. Place on the greased tray 1cm apart. Bake for 12-15 minutes or until scones sound hollow when tapped on top.
- 5. Use electric beaters to beat remaining cream in a bowl until firm peaks form.
- 6. Split scones and fill with jam, cream and raspberries. Dust with icing sugar to serve.
